Teaching and learning

Over the course of the year, KA's Enrichment coordinator, was able to teach across 5 year groups (Y2, 3, 4, 5 & 6). Team teaching techniques were used with 6 teachers offering quality CPD opportunities. This enables teachers to improve understanding of the structure of PE learning as well as develop specific skills and techniques for supporting pupils with their Physical education. Teachers were able to; see a range of warm ups and cool downs, organisation strategies, development from skills to game-like situations and specific PE vocabulary which is taught with certain skills.

At Kinson we were able to cover a varied curriculum in PE which covered a range of team (hockey, football, basketball & netball) and individual (Gymnastics, Dance and general fitness) sports. Fundamental skills were taught across KS1 along with gymnastics and dance.

KA's Enrichment coordinator worked collaboratively with other members of Ambitions Academy Trust to review the strengths and weakness of PE and sport in our school. Through doing this during the last term of the school year work began on rewriting a brand new PE curriculum with specific links to skills and with extra emphasis on assessment, this will support the PE offer in September 2020.

During the closure of schools, Kinson regularly sent out home learning with specific PE lessons for each year group. This included a Virtual Sports Day using platforms such as Google Drive, Google Forms and Youtube children to have a go whether they were in school or at home. This attracted 70 responses with the majority being from across the Primary range.

Prior to lockdown Kinson Academy worked closely with Oak Academy at inter-academy competitions which their leaders ran. Pupils competed in Netball, Tag Rugby and Hockey. This enabled were able 12 pupils across two teams of six to each competition.

Leadership and management

This year Kinson were members of the BSSA (Bournemouth School's Sports Association), Our enrichment coordinator has been involved in meetings with other schools in the area to build community links. During the closure of schools we were able to set challenges linked with BSSA and Dorset School Games for a variety of Virtual Sports Events. Dorset School Games were able to offer Athletics (replacement to Town Sports), Cricket, Football, Tennis and Dance. Due to this Kinson Academy were awarded with the Virtual Sports Games certificate from the School Games Organiser.

The model of the Virtual Sports Events supported the development of Kinson Academy's Virtual Sports Day.

We have continued to maintain strong partnerships with AFC Bournemouth Community Trust who w ran a range of wider curriculum workshops. These included;

- Reading Stars for Year 6
- PSHE lessons on Internet Safety KS1 and KS2
- Respect for both Year 5 & 6
- Block of lessons for Year 1 learning basic football skills which developed into small games.
- Year 5/6 Football tournament which allowed children to represent our school and attempt to qualify towards a regional tournament.

Similarly this year, we invited Dorset Cricket Partnership in to run 'Chance to Shine' workshops to ever year across the school. Unfortunately due to the closure of schools the KS1 event had to be cancelled but feedback from the KS2 sessions was fantastic and at Kinson we would look to do this again.

The house system remained in place during the 2019-20 academic year, at the end of all PE blocks inter-house competitions were held with all pupils in every year group. Children really enjoyed these competitions and loved trying to win points for their houses. This was similar in the Virtual Sports Day, pupils were competing for their house to win the annual sports day trophy.

Enrichment activities

At Kinson we were able to offer children a variety of clubs to participate in. They were run by Enrichment Coordinator, Teachers and additional help of a Parent. Through these clubs and lessons, teams were selected to compete in AAT inter-academy competitions. Despite many events being cancelled due to school closures we were able to offer 55 pupils an opportunity to compete for our school.

Across the year, we have been able to allocate 160 pupils (58%) a place within a club sometimes these children have been able to go to up to three clubs per term. All bar 3 in our Reception year group attended at least one club. This was the first time reception have been offered clubs since 2016.
